There have been over 5000 links of interest since June 2015 – sadly, we are unable to bring them to you in a curated format at this time.

Some UK News Headlines this week

(i) Patient safety is at risk because of increasing GP workloads in the UK, the RCGP are warning (<u>BBC</u><u>News</u>).

(ii) A bug in the Android mobile operating system has been discovered by researchers, who say it affects nearly a billion devices. The flaw can be exploited by sending a photo or video message to a person's smartphone, without any action by the receiver (<u>BBC News</u>).

(iii) Microsoft 365 is the first non-NHS email service to meet the secure health and social care email standard ISB1596, allowing users to send sensitive patient information (<u>Digital Health Intelligence</u>).

(iv) Chelsea and Westminster Hospital staff are using an electronic observations tool on mobile devices for faster detection of deteriorating patients in its acute assessment unit after completing a six-month trial within the department (<u>Digital Health Intelligence</u>).

(v) NHS England Chief Executive Simon Stevens and the NHS Five Year Forward View partners have <u>announced</u> eight new vanguards that will launch the transformation of urgent and emergency care for more than nine million people.
